Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



IMPACTING THE COMMUNITY — CHURCH OF SINGAPORE

Since 2000, St Luke's ElderCare (SLEC) has partnered Church of Singapore (COS) and her services arm, Tung Ling Community Services (TLCS), to engage our elders in a variety of activities such as exercises, sing-along sessions, festive celebrations and outings.

This partnership has grown over the years beginning with SLEC Hougang in 2000, followed by SLEC Tampines in 2003 and SLEC Marine Parade Centre in 2018.

The collaboration has also enabled us to engage members of the congregation during their Sunday services, raising awareness of and garnering support for our work.

On Sunday, 24 November, we were invited to speak at their English and Bilingual services, reaching out to about 1,000 members. We are thankful that 16 members had come forward to volunteer at SLEC. A sum of \$1,400 in donations by individual church members was raised as well.

TELOK AYER CHINESE METHODIST CHURCH

Telok Ayer Chinese Methodist Church (TACMC) has been a partner of St Luke's ElderCare (SLEC) Telok Blangah Centre since 2012. The TACMC team, led by Mr Ho Ann Chuan, Local Church Executive Committee (LCEC) member and lay leader, conducts a variety of weekly engagement activities with the centre's elders that include sharing sessions, games, and celebrations among others.

The team also aids in organising outings, ensuring our elders' safety whilst engaging them at various Singapore landmarks like Gardens by the Bay, Jewel Changi Airport, Tiong Bahru Food Centre and many more. We are thankful for the care and concern they have shown towards our elders.

On Sunday, 10 November, we were invited to share to approximately 1,000 members from TACMC's English, Mandarin and Hokkien services about the lives touched through our collaboration and about our upcoming nursing home, SLEC Residence, in Ang Mo Kio, scheduled to operate in May 2020.



Acquire knowledge and skills on moving and transferring elders, bed transfers

Learn to communicate with empathy Learn to plan elder-friendly activities
