Several St Luke's ElderCare (SLEC) centres, including our Bishan centre, have been designated as Active Ageing Centres (Care) by the Agency for Integrated Care (AIC). This initiative, now known as Active Ageing Centre (AAC) (Care) @ Bishan, enables SLEC to extend its services beyond facility walls, providing befriending and care for elders within the community.

When Senior Chaplain Jimmy Foong first visited Auntie Agatha (not her real name) at her home, she was already frail and home bound. Emotionally, Auntie Agatha seemed discouraged due to her limited mobility, often expressing a lack of purpose, and wishing to depart this life.

Gradually, Auntie Agatha warmed up to Jimmy and the befrienders from Trinity Christian Centre (TCC) who visited her periodically. They read the Bible, sang worship songs, including her favourite Hokkien tune, "Hold my Hand."

As her health declined, Auntie Agatha shared her final wish to visit Bishan Park and enjoy God's creation in nature. With her permission, Jimmy and the TCC befrienders organised a joyful outing to Bishan Park, singing praise songs accompanied by the ukulele.

This outing became one of Auntie Agatha's last trip outside her home. She peacefully passed on two months later. Jimmy reflected on the privilege they had to accompany Auntie Agatha in her final journey on Earth, cherishing the smiles they witnessed as priceless gifts.

Ms Heng also shared a poignant incident where the staff of SLEC went above and beyond:

"I want to highlight an incident in December 2023 when my mother had a fall at home and fainted while waiting for my brother. She managed to call the centre for help, which is conveniently located downstairs from our residence. The staff promptly called for an ambulance and also contacted my brother. They brought my mother to the centre for immediate assistance, including a head bandage to stop the bleeding. Thankfully, she only needed stitches for the head injury. We are immensely grateful for their swift and caring response."

Ms Heng further expressed gratitude for the opportunities provided to her mother:

"I would also like to thank the centre for allowing my mother, who is an avid painter, to teach a weekly Chinese Brush Painting class at the centre. This has not only kept her skills sharp but also brought her immense joy and pride in sharing her talents."

Acknowledging the challenges of caregiving, Ms Heng appreciated the counselling services offered by SLEC:

"I am thankful for the counselling services provided by Dan Ng, Principal Counsellor, and his referral to Eden Law. This assistance helped me manage my late aunt's estate and handled my mother's Will and Lasting Power of Attorney."

Ms Heng concluded her letter with warm words of appreciation:

"To the staff of SLEC, your love and dedication truly bring joy to our lives. Please continue to believe that you are a blessing to all of us—both beneficiaries and families alike!"

Since 2019, Elder Wong Tuck Keong and members of Bethesda Hall Ang Mo Kio have been faithfully reaching out to the elders at SLEC Senior Care Centre @ Kebun Baru.

Each month, a team of 6 to 10 members visits the senior care centre to engage the elders with songs, games, messages of God's love, and gift items during festive celebrations.

In May 2023, the team organised an eye and dental screening for 40 elders who otherwise would have difficulty accessing these services.

Elder Wong also involved children from Bethesda AMK Kindergarten, who performed songs and dances for the elders and collected donations of over 100 different food items for those in need.

When asked about their motivation to serve at SLEC, Elder Wong replied, "We wanted to extend our community services to the elderly in and around Ang Mo Kio, with the primary purpose of cheering and encouraging them in their golden years, especially those who are lonely and weak."
